Possibility of hazardous reactions : The aqueous solution of this substance is strong acid, reacts violently with

bases, and shows corrosive. Reacts with metals such as iron, aluminium and zinc to produce hydrogen. The high-concentration aqueous solution reacts weakly with many kinds of metals near room temperature, but at high temperatures it reacts violently with metals and their oxides, decomposes silicon dioxide and silicon carbonate, and slightly corrodes precious metals.
